SCHOLARLY ARTICLES

Academic reading will not only expand your knowledge but will also improve your own academic writing—vital for essays and for thinking ahead to EPQs and university.

Using these sites will also improve your research skills as you can experiment with your search techniques to find the best information.

JSTOR provides access to more than 12 million academic journal articles, books, and primary sources in 75 disciplines. If you are logged in to Office 365 as normal, you can link straight through to JSTOR from the RGS SharePoint home page.

DOAJ The Directory of Open Access journals does what it says—gives open access to a vast collection of journals. Try searching for a topic that interests you: <https://doaj.org/>

GOOGLE SCHOLAR A sub-section of Google, Google Scholar searches only scholarly articles. Give it a try at: <https://scholar.google.com/>
