GRAMMAR SCHOOL'S FUNDRAISING RESULTS IN NEW SPORTS FACILITY



Ripon Grammar School celebrated the launch of a new Astroturf pitch on Friday 20th May, which was made possible as a result of fundraising. The new pitch will further enhance sports facilities at the school and will be available outside of school hours for five-aside football and hockey teams in the wider Ripon community.

Back in 2008, Ripon Grammar School launched a fundraising campaign to build a new Sports Hall. Thanks to the generosity of parents, governors, staff and supporters through gifts, donations and pledges, the fundraising target of £750,000 was exceeded, and the new Sports Hall was opened in 2010 by England rugby legend Neil Back. The additional funds raised have paid for the new Astroturf pitch which was officially launched in May. The opening event featured a festival of sport including: football and hockey on the Astroturf, badminton, rock-climbing and Rock-It-Ball in the sports hall, swimming, tennis and cricket. Team GB even showed up to demonstrate fencing! This was followed by a drinks reception held in the library supported by Lockwoods.

The Sports Hall is now fully functional and is going from strength to strength. Almost every one of the available sessions outside the school timetable is being used by local clubs for a variety of sports such as netball, badminton and five-a-side football. The cricket nets proved to be particularly popular last term with about a dozen local cricket clubs using the nets for practise sessions on a regular basis.

Headmaster Mr Martin Pearman said "This is important for a number of reasons: firstly because it gives students at school and people in the Ripon community more opportunity to play sport and, secondly, because it provides an additional income stream for school".

Cleveland Land Services Ltd. commenced work last term on the Astroturf pitch located on the original 'Redgras' pitch alongside the Sports Hall. The provision of the Astroturf is significant as it will provide a full sized high quality playing pitch for hockey and also training facilities for football and rugby when the playing fields are unusable. The Astroturf also includes a 100m running track alongside the hockey pitch, which will be used for athletics training.

Dick Edwards, Chairman of the fundraising campaign, said "The generosity of our supporters and their continued commitment over a five year period has made a significant difference to sports provision within school and the wider Ripon area. The availability of the Astroturf will be another fantastic facility for the community".

STRATEGIC PLAN HELP BOOST THE SCHOOL **UPDATE BY** THE HEADMASTER

The Headmaster wrote to parents at the beginning of the year asking for volunteers to contribute to the schools' strategic vision for the next five years and beyond. Much has been achieved during the last five years regarding facility development: the Mathematics and Engineering block opened in 2007 followed by a brand new state-of-the-art Sixth-Form Centre shared with Ripon College in 2009. In 2010 we celebrated the opening of the sports hall. An official event to mark the opening of the Astroturf pitch was held on 20th May 2011.

Ripon Grammar School had applied to the North Yorkshire County Council for funding to extend the dining facilities and create a new classroom block to replace the temporary classrooms; however we have recently learned that our bids were unsuccessful.


Over the past two terms we have been consulting with parents, staff and students to discuss their varied priorities. It is important that we are all united behind Ripon Grammar School to secure the resources needed to support continued development in the next five years and beyond.

The strategic plan has now been drafted and it will be shared with all interested parties. The first event to discuss the plan involved a drinks reception for parents of forms 1A and 1B on 15th June. A further event for parents of students in 1C and 1D has been scheduled for 30th June.

Ripon Grammar School has secured funding from the local authority to build a new music block. It was originally anticipated that building would be completed by September 2011, however ground work investigations on the planned site revealed gypsum deposits, thus slowing down progress of the project.

Planning permission has been granted. However, the design of the building may need to be adjusted in light of recent energy efficiency legislation which has come into force. It is now hoped that work will commence in the autumn following the tendering process.

THE SCHOOL **GENERAL FUND?**



At present 134 out of 699 families contribute to the 'School General Fund' for which we are extremely grateful. The funds raised are ring-fenced and help to subsidise our drama and music activities at grass-roots level and the underwriting of public productions such as "Romeo and Juliet", "The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe" and "The Return to the Forbidden Planet". Any surplus generated by productions is always ploughed back into the fund, although some is used to improve the stock of lighting equipment and other drama resources.

The number of students involved in school games continues to be high and we have maintained an impressive range of sports matches for a state school of our size. The number of fixtures which are taking place in rugby, cricket, hockey and rounders, in addition to soccer and cross country running, has continued to grow. This is placing an increased demand on school funds to transport our players to matches and we all know how the price of petrol is rising!

The school also subsidises some school trips and further financial support is given to particular projects and to a large number of individual students to help those suffering genuine hardship with a contribution towards the cost of school uniform or participation in school trips. Every student in school therefore benefits to some degree from this support which helps the school run such a varied and rewarding programme.

ROSEMARY PRINGLE

A former RGS student has set herself not one but three challenges of a lifetime to raise money for charity. Rosemary Pringle who left Ripon Grammar in 2005 is fundraising for Cancer Research UK by sailing across the Atlantic Ocean, trekking up Mt Kilimanjaro and running the coast to coast trail.

Rosemary is attempting the challenges during her gap year following the completion of her degree at the University of Cambridge.

Rosemary started her challenge in February when she succeeded in making the 3175 nautical mile journey across the Atlantic Ocean. The crossing from Barbados was completed in three and a half weeks on a 72ft former racing yacht. She arrived in the Azores with the 15 other crew on 13th March. However, the voyage was not without its challenges. She had to compete with gale force 9 winds, four to five metre swells and the accompanying cold, fatigue and seasickness. "We didn't get to sleep for more than 3 hours at a time for 17 consecutive days, I was sick so often my teeth ached and at times our boat was blown over by the wind to the point that I found myself standing on things that once were vertical!"

After sailing she went on to trek Mt Kilimanjaro, which at 5,895m tall is the world's highest freestanding peak and Africa's highest mountain. Despite suffering from altitude sickness she reached the Uhuru peak on 7th May. "Doing a trek like that makes you appreciate the little things - like oxygen!"

Since returning from Africa, Rosemary has been focusing on training for her last challenge, to run from St Bees to Robin Hood's Bay following Wainwright's coast to coast trail. She aims to complete the 192 mile journey in one week, which will mean running over a marathon a day. Although a competitive runner who trained twice a day to represent Cambridge University, Rosemary said she specialised in 800m and 1500m races and has never done any long distance running before.

"Each of these challenges is a test of endurance with its own unique difficulties. However, all of them pale in comparison with what cancer patients must face every single day."



Rosemary wants to use her challenges to raise money for Cancer Research UK.

She lost her grandfather to cancer and her grandmother has also suffered from the disease, so she thinks it is important to "do her bit."

Rosemary has also worked alongside Cancer Research UK scientists while she was a student at Cambridge University and says she knows how well their money is used.

So far Rosemary has raised £2,000, and she is aiming for a total of £10,000.

"The trips are entirely self funded so every penny I raise in sponsorship and donations will go to charity," she said.

NEWS FROM THE Parents' Association

Ripon Grammar School Parents' Association (RGSPA) is a group of parents who volunteer their time to raise funds for school. They meet on a monthly basis to plan and discuss fundraising activities.

Fundraising over the past year has focused on a comedy evening in September which generated £800, Burns' Night in January which raised £3,000.00, and the RAW Talent art exhibition and Tapas Evening, sponsored by Lockwoods in April which boosted funds to the tune of £3,000. The lease for the school mini bus and its maintenance is also funded by RGSPA.

The group provides tea and coffee at parents' evenings and various school events. They recently called on all parents to help with cake stalls in Ripon Market place and parents responded magnificently baking exquisite cakes and buns, the first event of which raised £400. Due to the success of this event, a further cake stall has been booked for 9th July so get your cake tins ready!

The next big fundraiser is the 'Try Something New' Summer Draw (your chance to win an experience you will never forget) The draw, with more than 60 prizes, includes a luxury 5-star hotel stay in a period house, first class rail tickets, cookery and dance classes, a sea fishing trip and camping out at a 3-day music festival. The summer draw tickets will be distributed to all parents and the draw will be held in early July at Squiffys wine bar in Ripon.



Jonathan Tearle, Chairman of the RGSPA, said "We try our very hardest to assist the school in whatever way we can. The funding raised each year helps fund projects within school. As a specific example, a large proportion of funds raised from the RAW Talent weekend will be used to purchase art materials. We are extremely grateful to all parents, whether they are able to give up their time to attend the RGSPA meetings, or to help out once or twice a year serving tea and coffee at school events, or baking a cake for the cake stall - it all helps - or by supporting our activities by your attendance".

YOUTH CRICKET CRICKET EQUIPMENT BAGS

Last term, a funding application was submitted to The Lord's Taverners for £4,000 worth of cricket equipment. The Lord's Taverners are accredited by the England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB) as the official national charity for recreational cricket. Fifty percent of the funds it raises each year provide grants to support youth cricket.

Our funding application was approved and 19 local primary schools are now in receipt of Kwik Cricket sets bursting with equipment including: a small and medium bat, two kwik balls, two kinder balls and two stump sets. Ripon Grammar School also received a Colts bag on wheels containing cricket bats, batting gloves, wicket keeping pads, stumps and bails, cricket balls and helmets.

CAREERS EDUCATION AT RGS


