Work Experience.

Lower Sixth work experience is intended to take place the week beginning **12th July** (this can be slightly flexible depending on individual circumstances and on the Covid-19 situation) and is an excellent opportunity for you to develop a better understanding of a possible career path as well as developing your soft skills such as communication or working as part of a team.

The deadline to confirm your placement with Mr Walker is **Thursday 25th March**. If your placement is confirmed after this date NYBEP may not complete the necessary health and safety checks and therefore you cannot go out on your placement. It is vitally important you stick to this deadline.

I will send out, via email, the login details as soon as I receive them.

This database contains a whole variety of recent work placements and contact details to help get you get started. Whilst it is appreciated that you have lots of things to do with your new academic courses it is important that you think about and actively sort out your placement as soon as possible. Sorting your placement after the Christmas holidays is often too late.

When you have confirmed your placement with an employer please email Mr Walker with the name of the employer, the address where you will be working and a telephone number. Mr Walker will then produce the required paperwork.

If you are applying for work placements and you need help with your CV please email Mr Walker.

The school pays a great deal of money for the health and safety checks for your placements. Please note, if your placement is out of county there will be an additional charge for this which your parents/guardians will be asked to pay. This varies and, if this is the case, I will let you know the cost before you apply. If you are a Pupil Premium student, there may be funds available in school to cover this cost.

Your virtual work placement.

Many employers are beginning to offer virtual work placements because of the situation with Covid-19. Mr Walker receives many such offers and spends many hours finding fantastic virtual opportunities for you to consider. It is vitally important you check your school email accounts for his latest updates. Many virtual placements have a deadline for applications so it is important to read the fine detail of any virtual placement. Mr Walker will be publishing a revised list of virtual work placements details in the coming weeks.

Veterinary Students.

All veterinary colleges understand the difficulty for aspiring young vets to gain real hands on animal work experience before applying for a veterinary degree. As a group, they have agreed on an alternative to work experience and, if you are considering a veterinary career, please email Mr Walker for details of the course you must complete **before** applying for veterinary college.

Medical Students.

If you are considering applying for a work placement at Harrogate Hospital, they have not yet confirmed if this will be possible. Any updates and application forms will be emailed to students as soon as I receive them. The advice from many medical professionals is that students should be able to demonstrate their ability to deal with members of the public. Therefore, any work experience where you have to deal with the public will be vital in your personal statement and medical interviews.

Ways in which to broaden your knowledge and understanding.

In addition to work experience, there are a wide range of co-curricular opportunities for you to participate in during the year. Please check your school emails regularly for any messages I may send out highlighting new opportunities.

Below are just some of the opportunities already available:

Young Enterprise Company Challenge (Meet every Monday at 1pm in the cellars-Use Wednesday enrichment to complete your enterprise activities).

This is primarily aimed at Economic and Business Studies students but other people with other talents are very welcome. This is one of the school's flagship activities and we have been very successful in the past. You must be fully committed to this activity for the whole year as it will take up a lot of your free time in and out of school. You will meet one lunch time a week as well as using time during enrichment activities on Wednesday afternoons.
