## **Searching, Screening and Confiscation Policy**

## **Policy**

- School staff can search a student for any item *if the student agrees* (the ability to give consent may be influenced by the child's age or other factors).
- Headteachers, and staff authorised by them, have a statutory power to search students or their possessions
  without consent, where they have reasonable grounds for suspecting that the student may have a prohibited
  or banned item. For the purpose of this policy prohibited items are classed as:
  - Knives or weapons
  - Alcohol
  - Illegal drugs
  - Stolen items
  - Tobacco and cigarette papers
  - Fireworks
  - Pornographic images
  - Any article that the member of staff reasonably suspects has been, or is likely to be, used to commit an offence, or to cause personal injury to, or damage to the property of, any person (including student).

For the purpose of this policy banned items are classed as:

- Matches
- Vaping equipment and fluid
- Sharp cutting tools or blades
- Chewing gum
- Expensive item of school property
- School staff can seize any prohibited item found as a result of a search. They can also seize any item, however found, which they consider harmful or detrimental to school discipline.
- Schools are not required to inform parents before a search takes place or seek their consent to search their child
- Staff will inform parents when a search has been conducted and will inform parents of the outcome of a search. Schools should inform the individual student's parents or guardians where alcohol, illegal drugs or potentially harmful substances are found, though there is no legal requirement to do so.
- There is no legal requirement to make or keep a record of a search, but a record of the search will be kept on the student's file.
- Complaints about searching should be dealt with through the school's complaint procedure.
