The fact that students are so busy makes it all the more remarkable that we were able to enjoy the **senior production of 'She Stoops to Conquer'.** This was an outstanding production, coupled to an incredible amount of line-learning. Mr Fearnley and his team are worthy of congratulation for staging a very enjoyable production.

Our musicians excelled at the end of March with their **concert, featuring Vivaldi's Gloria.** Once again the range of talent and the commitment of students and staff made this a very impressive occasion and I am very grateful to Mr Seymour for staging it.

With regard to the **3G pitch**, it appears that the planning will be heard at North Yorkshire Committee level in June. Harrogate Borough Council has removed their objections to the proposals and governors are very happy with the financial arrangements to ensure that this facility is not a liability in the future from a financial perspective. The facility will cost in the region of £750,000 for which the school will not have to pay anything. It will be available for use by the community as well as by our students, and it will be floodlit which means it will be able to be used in the winter by the school. There is no doubt that this will be a tremendous facility for the school and I am delighted that it will reach fruition in the next year or so.

I have also submitted a bid to the DfE for a **dining facility** and, with additional monies being made available for grammar schools, there may well be some funding which RGS can take advantage of. A bid may need to be submitted in due course and I will pursue this next term if required.

Lower School Prizegiving on Wednesday, 12 July will feature Old Riponian Nick Chester, who is currently Technical Director for the Renault Formula 1 team. Invitations to this will be issued next term and he is bringing a Formula 1 car to display on the day, which I am sure will be of interest to many students as well as to parents.

I would like to inform you that the price of a 'meal deal' in the school canteen will increase from £2.30 to £2.35 with effect from Monday, 24 April. I am sure you will agree that this still represents excellent value for money and the number of students eating in school is one of the highest in any school in North Yorkshire. This reflects tremendously well on Mrs Gardner and her team who provide this service, but we will continue to strive to improve it, especially service towards the end of lunch. This was raised by parents in a recent questionnaire at a second form parents' evening.

A very successful **Study Abroad Roadshow**, organised by Student World, was held in school for the first time in March and attended by over one hundred students from the fourth, fifth years and sixth form. Representatives from thirteen universities from the USA, Canada, France, Spain, Germany and Switzerland were able to offer advice and guidance to our students about study abroad. The event provided an excellent opportunity for students to talk with delegates and to learn about what would be involved in applying to university outside of the UK and about study and life within each of their countries.

The **Yorkshire Cup rugby** took place in Wakefield and featured three teams, the U14s, U16s and 1st XV, but all three teams lost on the day. The 1st XV perhaps competed the best but lost 15-10 to Crossley Heath. It is a significant achievement to get three teams through to the Yorkshire Cup finals and both students and staff should be very proud.

More good news also on the **rugby** front, with the U14, U15, U16 and 1st XV all qualifying for the White Rose finals, with the U12s qualifying for the 'waterfall' tournament, which they won. The U14s finished runners-up in the White Rose, whilst both the U15 and 1st XV were crowned champions.

The U18 **girls' rugby** team were also crowned North Yorkshire champions and then competed in the Yorkshire round, finishing runners-up.

The U14 **girls' gymnastics** team took part in the Yorkshire Floor and Vault championships in Hull and the team won overall Bronze, while Isabella Weston won individual Gold in the vault.

Ella Foster has qualified for the indoor **athletics** UK finals and Joe Westgarth has been selected to represent North Yorkshire at **cricket**.

Well done to the junior and inter-girls' **cross country** teams who gained success when they finished second in the North of England Championships in Manchester this term. The third form boys' team also

finished an excellent fourth place. Alex Glegg and Marnie Scatchard represented North Yorkshire in the English Schools' cross country championships.

Congratulations to Mia Barnett, George White and Charlie Warne who came second in the regional **equestrian** show jumping competition recently, narrowly missing out on qualifying for the nationals.

Well done to David Blyton who represented England in **petanque** and to Ella Jamieson who won the North Yorkshire schools' **cyclocross** championships.

Jhapin Shahi has been selected for the England **VX** squad and Christa Wilson has qualified for the European Youth Olympic trials in **swimming**. Our congratulations go to them also.

The Summer term promises, as ever, to be exceptionally busy and there are a number of **events** which I hope parents will be able to attend, such as the PA Summer Ball, Lower School Prizegiving, the Junior Production and the Upper Sixth farewell evening. There is also a **welcome evening** for the new first form on 19 June, followed by their **induction day** on 20 June, and the **Open Evening** for entry to RGS in September 2018 on Monday, 26 June at 6.30pm. If you know of any parents who may be interested in attending this please make them aware.
